



FED:Aussies support junk food crackdown: study

A study by the Cancer Council Victoria and Obesity Policy Coalition says most Australians would support traffic light labelling on foods and banning junk food advertising during children's television viewing times.

The study found 87 per cent of 15-hundred Australians surveyed would support colour-coding on packaged food, to indicate healthier options, and 83 per cent would back a ban on junk food ads when children watch.

The study has been published in the Health Promotion Journal of Australia.
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
